



- 4) Encourage other partn by adopting standardized formats




#### WESTERN STATE WATER PROGRAM CAPABILITIES ASSESSMENT SURVEY & REPORT




# Schema Adjustments for v0.2 1) Central repository for methodology information


More GIS support


